The work to be performed by the consultant consists of preliminary engineering, environmental permitting and preparing final plans, specifications, and cost estimates for a one (1) mile road resurfacing project of 228th Avenue between SE 8th Street and NE 8th Street. The design and construction phases of this project contain federal funds through the National Highway System (NHS) Asset Management program.
